Truck Camper Set Up

Truck campers have become very popular among adventure seeking off grid enthusiasts. They require some specific equipment in order to safely carry the added weight, differing from travel trailers and fifth wheels that increase tow/hitch weight without maximizing payload capacity. Arctic Fox and Wolf Creek truck campers are designed to encompass the needs of several types of end users. Many of our customers use a duel rear wheel one ton, the extra set of tires helps control sway while traveling as well as increasing payload. We build several "short bed" models, the W/C 850, 890 and the A/F 811, 865, these campers are generally hauled in a single rear wheel one ton.

TorkLift builds some of the most innovative equipment on the market to fasten your truck camper to the vehicle, tow while carrying the unit, suspension upgrades for your pickup, and other accessories to custom tailor your unit to your needs. Frame mounted tie downs are designed for each specific year and model of vehicle, they provide a sturdy platform to secure to. They work in unison with their FastGun turn buckles that are tensioned to safely cushion the weight while in the truck. Their Super Hitch and Super Truss hitch extension system is a great choice for those wanting to tow a trailer while using their camper; they're available in several lengths to accommodate every application. Almost every pickup needs some sort of suspension modification, adding upper and lower StableLoads can help control the added weight of your truck camper and help minimize sway and compression as you travel. Customers wanting to add or change entry steps or battery boxes can find several good choices as well.

Proper set up will make traveling with a truck camper more enjoyable and safer for everyone on the road. We have seasoned camper customers who have a great understanding of the mechanics involved but there are people wanting to begin their journey and need some assistance.
